Member Spotlight: *Dahlia Ehrenfried*

Dahlia Ehrenfried, our TE Sisterhood president, answers some questions about her journey to Temple Emanuel and the Sisterhood, and what makes her tick.

Israel Family Trip 2022



There hadn't been a TE family trip to Israel since 2013, and one was in the planning stages when Covid hit. So in December 2022, sixteen families with grandparents, parents, teens and youngsters flew to Israel and had ten days filled with unforgettable experiences.

Amy Kahn said, "Our family joined TE about 10 years ago. It has been 30+ years since Ben, my husband, and I had been and the first with our children, Daniel (12) and Jacob (9). We were intrigued by the itinerary which offered many family-friendly activities. Not only were we excited to meet other families but my mother, Margie Kessler from Florida, came along making it a three generation trip! A special memory was when we gathered at the synagogue on Masada. As Rabbi Robinson began singing *Modeh ani*, we noticed other people from all around the world joined us. Jacob loved meeting the students who were his counterparts at our sister school in Haifa and Daniel loved climbing and enjoying the views at Masada, and meeting other 6th graders. Ben loved praying at the Kotel and the Jeep ride in the Golan Heights. My mother loved getting the dance party going with the teenage girls on the shore of the Kinneret."

Steven Feinstein and Jennifer London and their children, Elizabeth (14) and James (12), joined TE in 2021. Steve explained, "As newer members, we wanted to get to know other families while experiencing an amazing itinerary. The teen track was a plus for us, knowing our kids would be happy with their peers. I had never been to Israel and had always wanted to make the trip. There were many inspiring moments. I will cherish the memories of climbing Masada and praying at the Kotel with Jamie and connecting deeply with Lizzy at Yad Vashem. Jen and I were moved by visiting the Palmach Museum, the Peres Center for Peace and Innovation, and listening to the IDF guide in the Golan Heights. We even found time to visit my Israeli cousins. For our family, it was a wonderful experience, and we definitely feel closer to TE because of it."

Jennifer and Jonathan Bornstein and their kids, Raina (17) and Jordan (15), are a second generation TE family. Jennifer remarked, "Jonathan and I hadn't been in over twenty years and Raina will be off to college soon so the timing was perfect! Initially we hesitated signing on because we are self reported not "group travel people." But it was great! We all had different favorite moments. The kids loved

being with the other teens, while I continued to marvel at the Dead Sea. I loved floating in 1999 and loved it 20+ years later. We could not have developed the relationships with the other families were it not for this trip!"

The Lindenberg family, Bob and Meryl, their son Aaron, his wife Annie Tamis and their kids, Max (16), Zach (13) and Ben (11), joined the trip so that they could share the experience of Israel together. Meryl said, "We are new members of TE through membership in Minyan Ma'or so we were concerned that many people already knew each other which turned out not to be the case. It worked out well for all of us, especially the teens who went off with new friends and the enthusiastic guides. The trip brought to life the rich history of the Jewish people, the struggle of the pioneers and the dynamism of the people today. We loved climbing Masada, (for me 30 years older!) and the Dialogue in the Dark Museum. Max said that it was great meeting new people and Zach loved learning about life 2,000 years ago. The three generations returned with great memories and as Ben added, "I loved Israel so much that I'm definitely going back!" The rest of the family happily agreed!



Paula and Frank Aronson, Temple members for nearly 50 years, thought this would be a perfect trip to take with their grandchildren, Hallie (16), Gabe (15) and Eyan (11) from Westborough. Their enthusiasm infected their parents and another daughter and son-in-law, so off went the nine of them. Frank writes, "Words such as education, inspiration, friendship, kinship and amazement come to mind when thinking about the trip. We loved Kabbalat Shabbat at a Reform synagogue in Jerusalem, similar to Shabbat Alive! and Shabbat morning at a Conservative shul where Eyan followed along in the siddur. Whenever we met Israelis, we realized how much at home we felt."

Everyone agreed that after this trip together, they have connections they intend to nurture and maintain. Strangers at the Temple are now friends. Everyone raved about the tour guides who were articulate, funny, insightful and passionate about Israel. The Shul is Alive with the Sound of Music!

How popular is singing? More than 54 million Americans sing in one or more choirs or choruses. Not to mention the health benefits! Temple Emanuel has a children's choir, an adult choir, a women's choir and a Klezmer band to spread the joy of music.

Barbara Wallace Grossman, a Kol Emanuel soprano, read an article, *The Neurochemistry of Music*, which cited the benefits of music and its potential to improve health and well-being through the engagement of neurochemical systems. Barbara doesn't think about the neurochemical benefits when singing, but she says that it is an important part of her life. "After a busy day, sometimes the last thing I feel like doing is rushing to choir practice. But once I am there it is joyful and restorative. It is deeply meaningful to be singing Jewish music, contributing through events like Project Manna. At a dark time in this nation and the world, singing is profoundly affirming of our Judaism, our resilience as a community and our commitment to light and hope."

Norm Spack, a baritone, happily drives in from Revere. He had developed an unusual neurological condition that affected his singing. During the pandemic Eugenia and choir members encouraged him to keep up via Zoom. The condition went away and he returned to choir with more vocal range and power than before! Norm says, "I am looking forward to celebrating my 80th birthday in April with my second family, Kol Emanuel."

Deborah Lincoln, a new member who is an alto, recounts, "I have been singing for most of my life; I even took voice lessons but after graduate school, marriage, a career as a social worker and three children, singing took a backseat. This past September with the youngest in kindergarten, I felt the time was right. My aunt, Cheryl Turgel, a choir member, encouraged me to join. So with some trepidation and joy I did. I am proud to sing for my family, the congregation and myself. I hope other parents will consider taking a couple of hours to experience the pleasure of singing with this group of welcoming singers."

Yaffa Willner recalls "When I went to Shabbat Alive! for the first time, I heard Elias sing and I joined TE immediately. Every Friday night I was elevated to a world of spiritual bliss. A few years later I joined Kol Emanuel, and now I sing with Elias. Being in our choir has given me friendship, music and love. A choir friend once said to me 'I had the worst day ever today, and after an hour of singing together, I am at peace.' Not sure if it gets any better than that!"

In the fall of 2017, Eugenia invited TE members to learn and play klezmer music. Phyllis Wilker, a violinist, said, "The first year we started with a clarinet, melodica, cello, violin, and keyboard. We have added flute, accordion, guitar and vocalists. As with the choir, when Covid struck, Eugenia's technological expertise and dedication helped us create our first musical video collage for "Dayenu" in time for Pesach. It was daunting at first! We met on Zoom for most of 2020-21, then outside when it got warmer and finally we are back inside and looking forward to performing at TE and in the community." Al Kaplan, a clarinetist adds, "My participation enhances my connection to TE and Judaism. Eugenia's leadership is the force that keeps us playing and performing."

Zamira, the all women's choir, was a bright spot during the pandemic for its members and continues to be. Susan Spitz said that it was such a high point during Covid to be able to record Zoom performances with Zamira. She was alone at home but singing together with family and friends. And Lisa Golden added, "The bonds we've formed and singing Jewish music inspires and sustains us."

And who doesn't love watching our kids' choir, Kol Keff, perform? Solal Laurence (8) explained, "Not only is singing fun, but the snacks afterward are yummy." David Snyder (8) comments that, "Being in the choir means doing fun stuff like singing in front of a large audience. The songs are catchy and cool." His sister, Hannah (8), adds, "I love singing in Hebrew and English with other Jewish kids. It puts a smile on my face." And on ours too!

And how did Eugenia manage to keep music flowing when Covid hit? She explains, "The challenge was solved by having Zoom rehearsals. Members recorded individually and then I assembled more than 20 tracks into one. It was not as good as being in person but it kept everyone engaged and together. Many thanks to Elias and the TE leadership for their support."

Everyone is in agreement with Barbara Grossman who adds that "it is a privilege to sing with Elias and Eugenia. We value their professionalism and musicianship along with their warmth, kindness and sense of fun."

L'Dor Vador – From Generation to Generation

Continuity is hard to find these days. People frequently move away, change jobs, or just lose touch with connections to their past. So when a special connection comes full circle, it is worthy of note. Esther Beloff first started teaching at Temple Emanuel in 1981, and she still sits on the classroom floor, singing some of the same Shabbat songs with the children that she sang long ago. As she says, "They still work!" And now, the children of her earlier students are singing along with her.

Esther recognized the name on the class list before the school year began; she remembers her students vividly. "Once you're mine, you're always mine." She delights in teaching a second generation of her students and reconnecting with the families.

"Esther was my teacher at Temple Emanuel, close to 40 years ago, when I was in one of her first classes. I will never forget taking my son Max, now 8, to Temple Emanuel on his first day: we walked through the familiar doorway and there stood Esther. We were both thrilled to reconnect, and were touched by the significance of the moment. Since then, my daughter, Aria (now 5), has had Esther as her teacher, and our daughter, Shira (now 3), has her as well. Miriam, my wife, and I are so grateful that our kids are being cared for and loved by Esther and her colleagues, just as I was so many years ago. So much has changed since then, and it's a blessing that some things have not!"
